3 The jurors aforesaid upon their oaths aforesaid do further present that John Frazier, within one year next prior to the finding of this indictment, in the said County of Rockingham, did unlawfully receive ardent spirits, against the peace and dignity of the Commonwealth of Virginia.

✓ And the jurors aforesaid upon their oaths aforesaid do further present that John Frazier, within one year next prior to the finding of this indictment, in the said County of Rockingham, did unlawfully have in his possession a still, still cap, worm, tub, fermenter, and other appliances connected with and used in the operation of a still without having the same registered as required by law, and mash and other substances capable of being used in the manufacture of ardent spirits, against the peace and dignity of the Commonwealth of Virginia.

This indictment is found on the testimony of C. D. Fulk, H. W. Hoover, and A. S. Wiseman, witnesses sworn in court and sent before the grand jury to give evidence.


