

THIS INDENTURE MADE THE

30th day of March

1830 in the year of our Lord 1830 Between John H.

Effinger one of the Overseer of the Poor of the

District in the County of Rockingham of the one part and Isaac Hardesty of

the other part witnesseth, that the said Overeer of the Poor by virtue of an Order of the Court of the County aforesaid baring date the first day of March

in the year 1830 has placed and bound and by these presents doth place and bind Mary Wall a free girl of color of the age of Four years the 1st

day of May next to be an Apprentice with him the said Isaac Hardesty and as an Apprentice with him the said Isaac Hardesty to dwell from the

date of these presents, until the said Mary Wall shall arrive, and come to the age of Eighteen years, according to the Act of the General

Assembly in that case made and provided For and during all which time and term the said Mary Wall shall the said Isaac Hardesty

her said master well and faithfully serve in all such lawful Business as the said Isaac Hardesty shall be put unto by his said Master

according to the Power Wit and Ability of the said Mary Wall and the said Mary Wall honestly and obediently in all things be-

have towards the said Isaac Hardesty and honestly and orderly towards the rest of the Family of him the said Isaac Hardesty And the

said Isaac Hardesty for himself his Executors and Administrators doth hereby promise and covenant to and with the said Overseer of the

Poor and his Successor in office for the time being that the said Apprentice shall in the Craft, Mystery and Occupation of a Seamstress & House servant which

he the said Isaac Hardesty now useth, after the best manner that he can, or may teach, instruct, and inform, or cause to be taught, instructed and

informed, as much as thereunto belongeth, or in any wise appertaineth, and that he the said Isaac Hardesty shall also find and allow unto the said

Apprentice sufficient meat, drink, apparel, washing, lodging, and all other things needful or meet, for an Apprentice during the term aforesaid: And also that the said

shall teach, or cause to be taught to the Isaac Hardesty Reading, Writing, and Common Arithmetic including the

Rule of Three, and will moreover pay to the said Mary Wall the Sum of Twenty Dollars at the Expiration of the aforesaid Term.
