Linder in the sum of Five hundred Dollars, good and lawful money of the United States, and the said James L. Fleck in the sum of Five hundred Dollars of like good and lawful money, to be respectively made and levied of their several goods and chattels, lands and tenements, and they severally waived the benefit of their Homestead Exemption as to this obligation, and also waived any claim or right to discharge any liability to the Commonwealth arising under this recognizance with coupons detached from the bonds of this State, to the use of the Commonwealth of Virginia if the said John R. Linder shall make default in the performance of the conditions underwritten.

The condition of the above recognizance is such that if the above bound John R. Linder do and shall personally appear before the County Court of Rockingham on the 1<sup>st</sup> day of the February Term next thereof, being the 20<sup>th</sup> day of February 1882, at the Court-house thereof, and then and there answer a bill of indictment to be preferred to the Grand Jury in and for said County against him the said John R. Linder for a Misdemeanor by him committed, for

unlawfully and ~~feloniously~~ manufacturing, storing for sale, barter, gift or use, ardent spirits in the said County of Rockingham.
