

THIS INDENTURE MADE THE 10th day of October in the year of our Lord 1827 Between

*John H. Effinger* one of the Overseer of the Poor of the District in the County of Rockingham of the one part and *Henry Bolton* of the other part witnesseth, that the said Overseer of the Poor by virtue of an Order of the Court of the County aforesaid bearing date the 3<sup>rd</sup> day of September in the year 1827 has placed and bound and by these presents doth place and bind *Edmond Glap* of the age of about seven years to be an Apprentice with him the said *Henry Bolton* and as an Apprentice with him the said *Henry Bolton* to dwell from the date of these presents, until the said *Edmond Glap* shall arrive, and come to the age of Twentyone years, according to the Act of the General Assembly in that case made and provided For and during all which time and term the said *Edmond Glap* shall the said *Henry Bolton* well and faithfully serve in all such lawful Business as the said *Edmond Glap* shall be put unto by his said Master according to the Power Wit and Ability of the said *Edmond Glap* and the said *Edmond Glap* honestly and obediently in all things behave towards the said *Henry Bolton* and honestly and orderly towards the rest of the Family of him the said *Henry Bolton* And the said *Henry Bolton* for himself his Executors and Administrators doth hereby promise and covenant to and with the said Overseer of the Poor and his Successor in office for the time being, that the said Apprentice shall in the Craft, Mystery and Occupation of a *Carpenter* which he the said *Henry Bolton* now useth, after the best manner that he can, or may teach, instruct, and inform, or cause to be taught, instructed and informed, as much as thereunto belongeth, or in any wise appertaineth, and that he the said *Henry Bolton* shall also find and allow unto the said Apprentice sufficient meat, drink, apparel, washing, lodging, and all other things needful or meet, for an Apprentice during the term aforesaid: And also that the said *Henry Bolton* shall teach, or cause to be taught to the said *Edmond Glap* Reading, Writing, and Common Arithmetic including the Rule of Three, and will moreover pay to the said *Edmond Glap* the Sum of Twenty Dollars at the Expiration of the aforesaid Term.
