To the Sheriff of Roanoke County:

Whereas N. E. Grace shaw, Sheriff of Roanoke County, has this day made complaint and information on oath before me, J. A. to appear at the time and place of trial to give evidence on behalf of the Commonwealth on the examination touching the Said offense

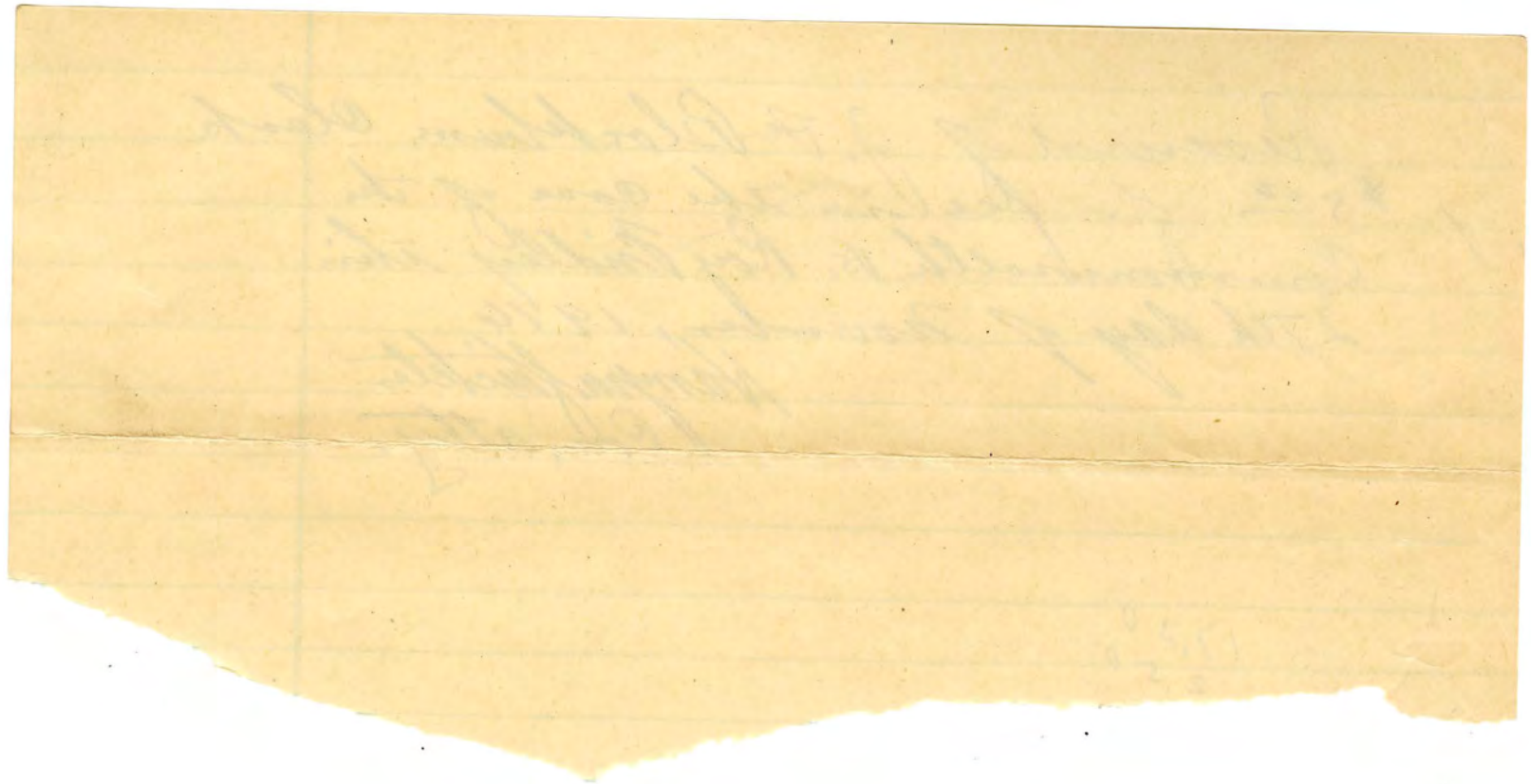
