

This Indenture made this 15th day of April in the year 1817
Between Aaron Solomon one of the Overseers of the poor in the County
of Rockingham of the one part and Jacob Reomer of the said County
of the other part Witnesseth that the said Overseer of the poor in pursuance
of an order of the County Court of Rockingham made at March Court
1817 do put and bind Ciddy Jackson of said County 7 years old the
the 9th day of March 1816 as an apprentice to the said Jacob Reomer
with him after the manner of an apprentice to dwell with and serve
him until she arrives at the age of Eighteen years In consideration
of which the said Jacob Reomer binds himself to the said Aaron Solomon
or his successors Overseers of the Poor to teach and instruct or cause
to be taught and instructed the said Ciddy the art and mystery of
Housewifery during said Term and moreover to find the said Ciddy
in good and sufficient clothes meat Drink washing and Lodging
fit and convenient for such apprentice and teach her reading and
writing and also at the end of her service shall pay and satisfy
unto the said Ciddy the sum of Twenty Dollars In Witness whereof
the said Aaron Solomon to the counterpart of these presents
hath set his hand and affixed his seal and the said Jacob Reomer
hath set his hand and affixed his seal the day and year above
written
