

This Indenture Witnesseth that Henry
Sipe one of the overseers of the poor for Rockingham county
Pursuant to an order of court held for said county on the ^{of December}
1810 hath and doth by these presents put and bind Fanny
Breedwell Daughter of John Breedwell of the age of ~~Nine~~
years the 24 Day of Decem: Last past apprentice to Henry
Overly untill she arrives at the age of Eighteen years During
term of time the said apprentice her said master shall
faithfully serve his secrets keep his lawfull commands
every where ^{gladly} obey she shall not damage her said masters goods
nor suffer it wilfully to be done by others she shall not buy
nor sell without leave of her said master nor commit fornication
nor contract matrimoney nor play at cards Dice or any other
unlawfull game During the said term nor wast nor lend
her said masters goods without leave But in all things behave
herselfe as a good honest and faithfull apprentice ought to do

In consideration whereof the said Henry Overly
doth Covenant and agree to provide and procure the said
apprentice good wholesome and sufficient meat Drink
washing Lodging and apparell fitting for such apprentice
During the said term and to teach or cause her to be taught
knitting sewing and spinning on big and Little wheell on
pleasantly and to teach or cause her to be taught Reeding
and wrighting compleat and at the expiration of said
term to give her fifteen Dollars for her freedom dues
Exclusive of her apparell In Witness whereof
Each party bind themselves to the other and have
hereunto set their hands and seals this 24th Day
of ^{October} in the year of our Lord 1811
