

This Indenture made this 8th day of December
in the year of our Lord eighteen hundred & thirteen
and in the thirty 8th of American Independence
Between Jeremiah Kyle & an Overseer of
the poor for the County of Rockingham of the
one part and Jesse Bowlin of the County of
of the other part Witnesses: That the aforesaid
Overseers by virtue of an order of Court of said
County and pursuant to an act of the General
Assembly in such cases made and provided have
put & bound and by these presents do put
and bind unto the s^d Jesse Bowlin a certain
Apprentice named Samuel Kyger to serve the
s^d Jesse Bowlin until the s^d Apprentice shall
come to the age of twenty one years. (Which s^d
Apprentice was born in the year of our Lord one
Thousand Seven hundred & 99. on the 19th day of March
In consideration of which the s^d Bowlin doth
agree to teach or cause to be taught unto the
s^d Apprentice Reading, Writing and Common
Arithmetic including the Rule of Three and also
the Art, Mystery or Occupation of a Shoo and
Boot maker (which is the s^d Bowlin now uses)
after the best manner that he can and
further the s^d Bowlin doth agree during the
s^d apprentice's servitude to provide for him
sufficient clothing, lodging & diet and all
other things useful and needful for an appren-
tice, and the s^d Bowlin doth further agree to give

the 2^d apprentice fifteen dollars for his freedom
due, In Witness Whereof the 2^d Jurors at
Kyle and Lapeer Bowlen, hath hereunto set
their hands & seals on the day and year first
above written.
