

THIS INDENTURE MADE THE 28<sup>th</sup> day of July — in the year of our Lord 1830 Between John Bowman  
one of the Overseers of the Poor of the first District in the County of Rockingham of the one part and Peter Stumbaugh of  
the other part witnesseth, that the said Overseer of the Poor by virtue of an Order of the Court of the County aforesaid bearing date the June day of Court  
in the year 1830 has placed and bound and by these presents doth place and bind Henry Butler — of the age of four teen years 25<sup>th</sup> december 1829  
to be an Apprentice with him the said Peter Stumbaugh and as an Apprentice with him the said Peter Stumbaugh to dwell from the  
date of these presents, until the said Henry Butler — shall arrive, and come to the age of Twenty one years, according to the Act of the General  
Assembly in that case made and provided For and during all which time and term the said Henry Butler — shall the said Peter Stumbaugh  
well and faithfully serve in all such lawful Business as the said Henry Butler — shall be put unto by his said master  
according to the Power Wit and Ability of the said Henry Butler — and the said Henry Butler — honestly and obediently in all things be-  
have towards the said Peter Stumbaugh and honestly and orderly towards the rest of the Family of him the said Peter Stumbaugh And the  
said Peter Stumbaugh for himself his Executors and Administrators doth hereby promise and covenant to and with the said Overseer of the  
Poor and his Successor in office for the time being, that the said Apprentice shall in the Craft, Mystery and Occupation of a Blacksmith — which  
he the said Peter Stumbaugh — now useth, after the best manner that he can, or may teach, instruct, and inform, or cause to be taught, instructed and  
informed, as much as thereunto belongeth, or in any wise appertaineth, and that he the said Peter Stumbaugh shall also find and allow unto the said  
Apprentice sufficient meat, drink, apparell, washing, lodging, and all other things needful or meet, for an Apprentice during the term aforesaid: And also that the said  
Peter Stumbaugh shall teach, or cause to be taught to the said Henry Butler — Reading, Writing, and Common Arithmetic including the  
Rule of Three, and will moreover pay to the said Henry Butler — the Sum of Twenty Dollars at the Expiration of the aforesaid Term.  
IN WITNESS whereof the Parties to these Presents have interchangeably set their Hands and Seals the Day and Year above written.
