

This Indenture

MADE, THE

16th day of ~~November~~ ^{December}

in the year of our Lord 1844 Between Robert M. Kyle

one of the Overseer's of the Poor of the _____ District in the County of Rockingham of the one part, and William P. Kyle of the other part witnesseth, that the said Overseers of the Poor by virtue of an Order of the County aforesaid bearing date the 17th day of June in the year 1844 has placed and bound and by these presents doth place and bind George a Colours Boy ^{and Charles Barbara} of the age of 15 years ^{15th day of April} ~~1836~~ to be an Apprentice with him the said William P. Kyle and as an Apprentice with him the said William P. Kyle to dwell from the date of these presents, until the said George shall arrive, and come to the age of Twenty one years, according to the Act of the General Assembly in that case made and provided. For and during all which time and term the said

George shall the said William P. Kyle well and faithfully serve in all such lawful Business as the said George shall be put unto by his said Master according to the Power, Wit and Ability of the said George and the said George honestly and obediently in all things behave towards the said William P. Kyle and honestly and orderly towards the rest of the Family of him the said William P. Kyle

And the said William P. Kyle for himself his Executors and Administrators doth hereby promise and covenant to and with the said Overseer of the Poor and his Successor in office for the time being, that the said Apprentice shall in the Craft, Mystery and Occupation of a Miller, Husband of farming which he the said William P. Kyle now useth, after the best manner that he can, or may teach, instruct, and inform, or cause to be taught, instructed and informed, as much as thereunto belongeth, or in any wise appertaineth, and that the said William P. Kyle shall also find and allow unto the said Apprentice sufficient meat, drink, apparel, washing, lodging, and all other things needful or meet, for an Apprentice during the term aforesaid: And also that the said William P. Kyle shall teach, or cause to be taught to the Reading, Writing and Common Arithmetic including the Rule of Three, and will moreover pay to the said Overseer of the Poor the Sum of _____ Dollars at the Expiration of the aforesaid Term.

IN WITNESS whereof the Parties to these Presents have interchangedly set their Hands and Seals the Day and year above written. Overseer of the Poor, or their agent, and the said George, the sum of \$100 ^{in money} ~~of the sum of~~ One Hundred Dollars in the following ^{manner} to wit four dollar annually to the said Overseer of the Poor, or their agent, for 13 years commencing on the 17th day of May 1843 and when the said George shall arrive to the age of Twenty one years, ^{pay him} forty Eight dollar. the said William P. Kyle having appeared in Court and agreed to take the said boy on the above Term. In Witness whereof the said parties to these presents have hereunto set their hands and seals on the day and year above written.
