

This Indenture MADE THE 1st day of *April*

in the year of our Lord 1844 Between *Peter Henton*

one of the Overseer's of the Poor of the _____ District in the County of Rockingham of the one part, and
Reuben A Harrison of the other part witnesseth, that the said Overseers of the Poor by virtue of
an Order of the County aforesaid bearing date ~~the~~ *March* ~~last~~ *last* day of _____ in the year 1844 has
placed and bound and by these presents doth place and bind *George Beaton* of the age of *Nine*
on the 14 day of February last years to be an Apprentice with him the said *Reuben A Harrison* and as an Apprentice
with him the said *Reuben A Harrison* to dwell from the date of these presents, until the said
George Beaton shall arrive, and come to the age of *21* years, according
to the Act of the General Assembly in that case made and provided. For and during all which time and term the said
George Beaton shall the said *Reuben A Harrison*
well and faithfully serve in all such lawful Business as the said *George Beaton* shall be put unto
by his said *Master* according to the Power, Wit and Ability of the said *George Beaton* and
the said *George Beaton* honestly and obediently in all things behave towards the said *Reuben*
A Harrison and honestly and orderly towards the rest of the Family of him the said *Reuben A Harrison*

And the said *Reuben Harrison* for himself his Executors and Administrators doth hereby
promise and covenant to and with the said Overseer of the Poor and his Successor in office for the time being, that the said
Apprentice shall in the Craft, Mystery and Occupation of *a Farmer* which he the said
~~very party~~, after the best manner that he can, or may teach, instruct, and inform,
or cause to be taught, instructed and informed, as much as thereunto belongeth, or in any wise appertaineth, and that the said
Reuben A Harrison shall also find and allow unto the said Apprentice sufficient meat, drink, apparel,
washing, lodging, and all other things needful or meet, for an Apprentice during the term aforesaid: And also that the said
Reuben A Harrison shall teach, or cause to be taught to the *George Beaton*
Reading, Writing and Common Arithmetic including the Rule of Three, and will moreover pay to the said
George Beaton the Sum of *Twenty* Dollars at the Expiration of the aforesaid Term.
