

This Indenture made this 14th day
of January in the year of our Lord
1812 between Elizabeth Firebough and
Henry Firebough of the County of
Rockingham and State of Virginia of the one
part and Joseph Roehenour of the same
County and State of the other part
~~Witnesseth~~, that the S^r Henry Firebough,
voluntarily, and with the approbation of
the S^r Elizabeth Firebough his Guardian,
hath put placed and bound himself, and
by these presents doth put ~~and~~ place,
and bind himself to be an apprentice
with him the S^r Joseph Roehenour, and
as an apprentice with him the S^r Roehenour
to dwell for the term of three seasons
Nine month in each season, to commence
on the first day of March ^{next} and to end
on the first day of December, in each
year for the term of three years, during
all which Term the S^r Elizabeth Firebough
and Henry Firebough doth covenant and
agree to and with the S^r Roehenour
that the S^r Henry Firebough, the said
Roehenour shall well and faithfully serve
in all such lawfull business as the S^r
Henry Firebough shall be put unto by
his S^r Master, according to the best of
the power, wit and ability of him the S^r
Henry Firebough and honestly and obediently
shall behave himself towards the S^r
Joseph Roehenour, and honestly and orderly
towards the family of the S^r Roehenour
and the S^r Roehenour on his part doth
covenant and agree to and with the S^r

Henry Firebough, that he the P.
Hochenour will well and truly instruct
the P. Henry Firebough, in the art or
mystery of a Stone Mason and Brick
laying, which the P. Hochenour now
followeth, and will use all due
diligence to make the P. Henry Firebough
as perfect in the P. art or mystery of
a Stone Mason or bricklaying as possible
and that the P. Hochenour will allow
to the P. Henry Firebough good and
sufficient meat, drink, washing, mending
and lodging for the term of Nine
Months in each season, and the P.
Hochenour agrees to give unto P.
Henry Firebough Twenty Dollars at
the expiration of every season for the
term first above mentioned and he
the P. Hochenour also agrees to give the
P. Henry Firebough six days in
every harvest for himself. In Witness

first above written,
