J. H. Hesse, Orville Garber and *Dr. H. W. Montz*
witnesses sworn in court and sent before the Grand Jury to
give evidence.

Be it Remembered that on the 13th day of April 1920,
Galen Miller and H. M. Miller
came before me J. H. Keiter a justice
of the said county of Rockingham, and severally and respectively acknowledged themselves to be indebted to the
Commonwealth of Virginia, in manner and form following, that is to say: the said Galen Miller
_____ in the sum of Five Hundred _____ Dollars,
good and lawful money of the United States, and the said H. M. Miller
in the sum of Five Hundred _____ Dollars of like good and lawful money, to be
respectively made and levied of their several goods and chattels, lands and tenements, and they severally waived
the benefit of their Homestead Exemption as to this obligation, and also waived any claim or right to discharge any
liability to the Commonwealth arising under this recognizance with coupons detached from the bonds of this State,
to the use of the Commonwealth of Virginia if the said Galen Miller
shall make default in the performance of the conditions underwritten.

The condition of the above recognizance is such that if the above bound Galen Miller
_____ do and shall personally appear before the Circuit Court of Rockingham
on the 1st day of the next Term next thereof, being the 19th day of
April 1920, at the Court-house thereof, and then and there answer a bill of indictment
to be preferred to the Grand Jury in and for said County against him the said Galen Miller
_____ for a Misdemeanor by him committed, for
unlawfully ~~and feloniously~~ selling, exposing for sale, and
giving away ardent spirits on Sunday the

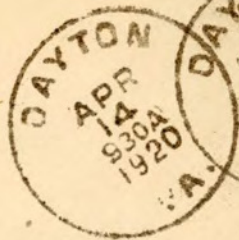
