MADE THE 29<sup>th</sup> day of December in the year of our Lord 1835 Between John F. Effinger

one of the Overseer of the Poor of the first District in the County of Rockingham of the one part and Leonard Tutuiler of the other part witnesseth, that the said Overseers of the Poor by virtue of an Order of the Court of the County aforesaid bearing date the October Court in the year 1835 has placed and bound and by these presents doth place and bind James Byrd a free Boy of colour of the age of Thirteen years to be an Apprentice with him the said Leonard Tutuiler and as an Apprentice with him the said Leonard Tutuiler to dwell from the date of these presents, until the said James Byrd

shall arrive, and come to the age of Twenty one years, according to the Act of the General Assembly in that case made and provided. For and during all which time and term the said James Byrd shall the said Leonard Tutuiler well and faithfully serve in all such

lawful Business as the said James Byrd shall be put unto by the said Leonard Tutuiler according to the Power, Wit and Ability of the said James Byrd and the said James Byrd honestly and obediently in all things behave towards the said Leonard Tutuiler

and honestly and orderly towards the rest of the Family of him the said Leonard Tutuiler And the said Leonard Tutuiler for himself his Executors and Administrators doth hereby promise and covenant to and with the said Overseer of the Poor and his Successor in office for the time being that the said Apprentice shall in the Craft, Mystery and Occupation

of a Skin draper & Glove maker which he the said Leonard Tutuiler now useth, after the best manner that he can, or may teach, instruct, and inform, or cause to be taught, instructed and informed, as much as thereunto belongeth, or in any wise appertaineth, and that he the said Leonard Tutuiler shall also find

and allow unto the said Apprentice sufficient meat, drink, apparel, washing, lodging, and all other things needful or meet, for an Apprentice during the the term aforesaid: And also that the said Leonard Tutuiler shall teach, or cause to be taught to the

Reading, Writing and Common Arithmetic including the Rule of Three and will moreover pay to the said James Byrd the Sum of Twenty Dollars at the Expiration of the aforesaid Term.
