The grand jurors in and for the body of said County of Rockingham and now attending said Court at its October term, 1922, upon their oaths, do present that Charlie Cochran within one year next prior to the finding of this indictment, in the said County of Rockingham, did unlawfully manufacture, sell, offer, keep, store and expose for sale, give away, transport, dispense, solicit, advertise and receive orders for ardent spirits, against the peace and dignity of the Commonwealth of Virginia.

And the jurors aforesaid, upon their oaths aforesaid, do further present that Charlie Cochran within one year next prior to the finding of this indictment in the said County of Rockingham, did unlawfully and feloniously manufacture, sell, offer, keep, store and expose for sale, give away, transport, dispense, solicit, advertise and receive orders for ardent spirits; and then and there the said Charlie Cochran committed the second offense against the prohibition laws of the Commonwealth of Virginia, in that the said Charlie Cochran was heretofore convicted on February 2, 1917, in the Circuit Court of Rockingham County, Virginia, for violating the prohibition laws of the State of Virginia, and then and there was sentenced to pay a fine of Fifty Dollars and serve one month in jail, against the peace and dignity of the Commonwealth of Virginia.

This indictment is found on the testimony of H. D. Brown, F. C. Parmer, J. C. Elliott, and J. E. Barkey, witnesses sworn in Court and sent before the grant jury to give evidence.

Whereas *H. D. Brown* *State Inspector* of the said *city*

of *Harrisonburg* has this day made complaint and information on oath  
before me *Shiffey L. Devere*, a Justice of the Peace of said *city*,

that he has cause to believe and does believe that ardent spirits are being manufactured or stored  
for sale, barter, gift, or use, in violation of law, in a certain dwelling house or outbuildings,  
situate in the *city* of *Harrisonburg* and in the County of Rockingham, Virginia,  
and occupied by *Charlie Cochran*

These are, therefore, in the name of the Commonwealth of Virginia to command you forth-  
with to search said buildings for ardent spirits and their containers, and bring the same and the  
person in whose possession they are found before me or some other Justice of the said.....  
to answer the said complaint and to be further dealt with according to law.
