Court in the year 185*2* has placed and bound and by these presents doth place and bind *William Tate Alias Mowry* of the age of *Twelve years 10 months* to be an Apprentice with him the said *Conrad Senger* and as an Apprentice with him the said *Conrad Senger* to dwell from the date of these presents, until the said *Wm Tate Alias Mowry* shall arrive, and come to the age of *Twenty one* years, according to the Act of the General Assembly in that case made and provided. For and during all which time and term the said *Wm Tate Alias Mowry* shall the said

Conrad Senger well and faithfully serve in all such lawful Business as the said *Wm Tate Alias Mowry* shall be put unto by *him* said *Conrad Senger* according to the Power, Wit and Ability of the said *Wm Tate Alias Mowry* and the said *Wm Tate Alias Mowry* honestly and obediently in all things behave towards the said *Conrad Senger* and honestly and orderly towards the rest of the Family of him the said *Conrad Senger* And the said *Conrad Senger*

for himself & his Executors and Administrators doth hereby promise and covenant to and with the said Overseer of the Poor and his Successor in office for the time being, that the said Apprentice shall be instructed in the Craft, Mystery and Occupation of *Agriculture & Farming* which he the said *Conrad Senger* now useth, after the best manner that he can, or may teach, instruct, and inform, or cause to be taught, instructed and informed, as much as thereunto belongeth, or in any wise appertaineth, and that the said *Conrad Senger*

shall also find and allow unto the said Apprentice sufficient meat, drink, apparel, washing, lodging, and all other things needful or meet, for an Apprentice during the term aforesaid: And also that the said *Conrad Senger* shall teach, or cause to be taught to the said *Wm Tate Alias Mowry* Reading, Writing, and Common Arithmetic including the Rule of Three, and will moreover pay to the said *Wm Tate Alias Mowry* the sum of *One Hundred Dollars in current money* Dollars at the Expiration of the aforesaid Term.

taught to the said *John D. Sawyer* Reading, Writing, and Common Arithme- tic including the Rule of Three, and will moreover pay to the said *John D. Sawyer* the sum of *Five Dollars* at the expiration of the aforesaid Term.
