Dear Sir:

As requested in your letter of March 13, I am herewith enclosing statement of clerk's fees, etc., arising out of the Shenandoah National Park Condemnation proceeding pending in this County, up to March 15. I have gone over these fees very carefully and have included only such items as I think your office is entitled to pay.

There is, of course, a good deal of work that the clerk has been doing for which no charge has been made, especially concerning the filing of petitions for payment of awards including the certified copies of the order sent to the State Treasurer. In the beginning Judge Bertram advised the clerk that he thought your office should pay for these services, but later I understood that your office held it was doubtful of the authority to pay for same; therefore the first fifty petitioners who received their money from the State Treasurer paid the clerk no fee at all, and under the circumstances I naturally will not attempt to collect same from them.

I trust, therefore, that the bill will be allowed as rendered.
