of the other part, witnesseth, that the said Overseer of the Poor aforesaid by virtue of an Order of the Court of the County aforesaid
barring date the 31st day of November in the year 1823

has placed and bound and by these presents doth place and bind Peggy Cummins of the age
of About Eight years, to be an Apprentice with him the said George Rodes
and as an Apprentice with him the said Rodes to dwell from the date of these presents,

until the said Peggy shall arrive and come to the age of Eighteen
years, according to the Act of the General Assembly in that case made and provided, by and during all which time and term the said

Peggy Cummins shall the said Rodes her ~~his~~ said

Master well and faithfully serve in all such lawful Business as the said Peggy Cummins

shall be put unto by her said Master according to the Power, Wit and Ability of her

the said Peggy Cummins honestly and obediently in all things behave towards her

said Master and honestly and orderly towards the rest of the Family

of the said George Rodes And the said George Rodes

for himself Executors and Administrators doth hereby promise and covenant to and with the said Overseer of the Poor and his

Successor for the time being, that the said Apprentice shall in the Craft, Mystery and Occupation of a ~~Shin-stuff~~ ~~Swem-stuff~~ ~~the~~

which he the said Rodes in his family now useth, after the best manner that he can or may teach,

instruct and inform or cause to be taught, instructed and informed, as much as thereunto belongeth or in any wise appertaineth, and that

he the said George Rodes shall also find and allow unto the said Apprentice sufficient

meat, drink, apparell, washing, lodging, and all other things needful or meet for an Apprentice during the term aforesaid: And also that

the said Rodes shall teach or cause to be taught to the said Peggy proper

Reading, ~~Writing~~, and Common Arithmetic including the Single Rule of Three, and will moreover pay to the said

Peggy the Sum of Twenty Dollars at the Expiration of the
