date of these presents, until the said W. Gladue shall arrive, and come to the age of 21 years, according to the Act of the General

Assembly in that case made and provided For and during all which time and term the said W. Gladue shall the said John Garber

well and faithfully serve in all such lawful Business as the said W. Gladue shall be put unto by his said Master

Poor and his Successor in office for the time being, that the said Apprentice shall in the Craft, Mystery and Occupation of Farming which

he the said J<sup>no</sup> Garber now useth, after the best manner that he can, or may teach, instruct, and inform, or cause to be taught, instructed and

informed, as much as thereunto belongeth, or in any wise appertaineth, and that he the said J<sup>no</sup> Garber shall also find and allow unto the said

Apprentice sufficient meat, drink, apparel, washing, lodging, and all other things needful or meet, for an Apprentice during the term aforesaid: And also that the said

J<sup>no</sup> Garber shall teach, or cause to be taught to the said Washington Gladue Reading, Writing, and Common Arithmetic including the

Rule of Three, and will moreover pay to the said W. Gladue the Sum of 20 Dollars at the Expiration of the aforesaid Term.
