

# THIS INDENTURE

MADE THE 28<sup>th</sup> day of August 1820  
in the year of our Lord 1820 Between Joseph Hancock Overseer of the Poor of the  
Town District in the County of Rockingham of the one part and Isaac Hardisty  
of the other part, witnesseth, that the said Overseer of the Poor aforesaid by virtue of an Order of the Court of the County aforesaid  
bearing date the day of August in the year 1820  
has placed and bound and by these presents doth place and bind Virginia Viar of the age  
of 10 years, to be an Apprentice with him the said Isaac Hardisty  
and as an Apprentice with him the said Isaac Hardisty to dwell from the date of these presents,  
until the said Virginia Viar shall arrive and come to the age of Eighteen  
years, according to the Act of the General Assembly in that case made and provided, by and during all which time and term the said  
Virginia Viar shall the said Isaac Hardisty his said  
apprentice well and faithfully serve in all such lawful Business as the said Virginia Viar  
shall be put unto by her master according to the Power, Wit and Ability of her  
the said Virginia Viar honestly and obediently in all things behave towards the said  
Isaac Hardisty said and honestly and orderly towards the rest of the Family  
of the said Isaac Hardisty And the said  
for himself Executors and Administrators doth hereby promise and covenant to and with the said Overseer of the Poor and his  
Successor for the time being, that the said Apprentice shall in the Craft, Mystery and Occupation of a  
which he the said Isaac Hardisty now useth, after the best manner that he can or may teach,  
instruct and inform or cause to be taught, instructed and informed, as much as thereunto belongeth or in any wise appertaineth, and that  
he the said Isaac Hardisty shall also find and allow unto the said Apprentice sufficient  
meat, drink, apparell, washing, lodging, and all other things needful or meet for an Apprentice during the term aforesaid: And also that  
the said Isaac Hardisty shall teach or cause to be taught to the said Virginia Viar  
Reading, Writing, and Common Arithmetic including the Single Rule of Three, and will moreover pay to the said Virginia  
Viar the Sum of Twenty Dollars at the Expiration of the  
aforesaid Term. IN WITNESS whereof the Parties to these Presents have interchangably set their Hands and Seals the Day and Year  
above written.
