A pared down version of the exhibit was also permanently installed in all four high schools in Rockingham County in 2016.



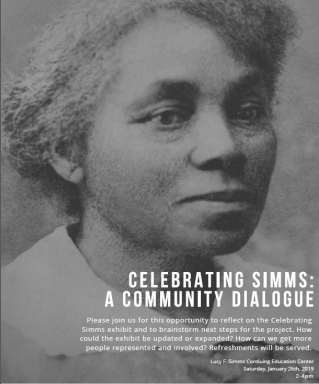
